About the Tutor – Carlo Canevali – Moving Into Music Drum Teacher

Carlo holds a Master of Arts in Jazz Music from the State Conservatory of Adria, Italy. Carlo has taught in music schools in northern Italy and between 1992 and 2013 he was the drum, rhythm and musicianship teacher at the CDM school of Rovereto and for the Bachelor of Arts program certified Edexcel, London. Carlo has performed throughout Europe, has recorded 32 CDs and won prizes in Contests for Sound-track Improvisation and Jazz Instrumental Performance. In 2009 he founded the record label nBn Music and in 2011 he published the text *The Rhythm Book - Il Linguaggio Del Ritmo*.



Carlo now resides in Australia. He combines his love of teaching with his passion for performance and promotion of the arts.

About the System - Takadimi - from The Rhythm Book

Takadimi is the system of rhythmic solfége used throughout the workshops. It does for rhythm what "do re mi" solfége does for pitch. It gives us a way to label the parts of a rhythm and can make it easier both to understand and to perform. Takadimi is beat oriented; that is, it assigns syllables based on the position of the note within the beat. It is also pattern based. Reading rhythm with Takadimi helps you learn to recognize rhythmic patterns and see groupings of notes, not simply read note to note. Reading rhythm this way is similar to the way we read groups of letters as words and not one letter at a time.
